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

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MAHRAM

Mahram is a person to whom one is eternally forbidden to marry.

List of female *mahram* for a man:

- 1. Kinship:
 - a) Mother and grandmother (paternal and maternal) and above
 - b) Child and grandchild and below
 - c) Sister
 - d) Maternal aunt
 - e) Paternal aunt
 - f) Daughter of male sibling
 - g) Daughter of female sibling

2. Suckling:

- a) The mother who suckled him
- b) Female who suckled from the same mother
- 3. Four People Because of Marriage Ties:
 - a) His mother-in-law, including the wife's paternal/maternal grand mother
 - b)Stepdaughter whose mother he was intimate with
 - c) His daughter-in-law or granddaughter-in-law; after the death or divorce of his son or his grandson
 - d)Sister-in-law, for as long as his wife is living or he and his wife are still married

c) Order of Priority of a Guardian (Order of Guardians)

- 1. Birth father
- 2. Paternal grandfather
- 3. Full brother
- 4. Paternal half-brother
- 5. Full brother's son
- 6. Paternal half-brother's son
- 7. Father's full brother
- 8. Father's paternal half-brother
- 9. The son of the father's full brother (cousin)
- 10. The son of the father's paternal half-brother (cousin)
- 11. The full brother of the father's father (grand uncle)
- 12. The paternal brother of the father's father (grand uncle)
- 13. The son of the full brother of the father's father (cousin's father)
- 14. The son of the paternal brother of the father's father (cousin's father)
- 15. The full brother of the father's grandfather (great grand uncle)
- 16. The paternal brother of the father's grandfather (great grand uncle)
- 17. The son of the full brother of the father's grandfather and below
- 18. The son of the paternal brother of the father's grandfather and below
- 19. Sultan (King Guardian)

The order of guardians stated above is according to priority. In the event the father is deceased, or is disqualified as the guardian, then the guardianship of the child falls on her grandfather, and so on.

MAWADDAH FAMILY GUIDE

INTRODUCTION

The Kelantan Mawaddah Family Policy was formulated on 11 December 2009. Hence, serious effort must be made to build and strengthen the family. The Kelantan state mawaddah family criteria were drawn up as a guide and reference for the people in Kelantan in order to mould the desired family institution.

OBJECTIVES

The Mawaddah Family Guide was formulated to achieve the following objectives:

- 1. To determine the level of achievement of the mawaddah family characteristics by families in Kelantan
- 2. To identify the level of preparation and implementation of training needs, courses, family development programmes by agencies concerned
- 3. To determine family policies and development strategies that should be improved in line with developments and challenges

a) Responsibilities of a Guardian in Marriage

- 1) To be the guardian in the marriage of his dependant
- 2) Magistrate Guardian or Regent

Reasons for Guardianship through Magistrate Guardian

- 1) There is no guardian by kinship
- 2) Illegitimate child or adopted child
- 3) Guardian is disqualified
- 4) The close guardian is performing hajj or umrah
- 5) Guardian refuses to marry off the child
- 6) Guardian is away or missing

b) Responsibilities of a Guardian in General

- 1) To guide all his dependants to be good in this world and in the hereafter
- 2) To provide for his dependants adequately according to his ability

Appendix A

GUARDIAN

A guardian is an individual authorised by Islamic laws responsible for the well-being of the persons in his charge over the affairs of someone. His role is to take care of the interests and needs of those under his supervision, such as orphans, the disabled, the mentally incapacitated, virgin etc.

Requirements of a Guardian

- 1. Is a Muslim
- Is a male
- 3. Is physically mature
- 4. At his own discretion and willingness, not by compulsion
- 5. Not in 'ihram' for hajj or umrah
- 6. Not a sinner (fasiq)
- 7. Not a defect of minds

Responsibilities of a Guardian

In general, the guardian's responsibilities can be divided into two main parts:

FOR WHOM?

This guidebook is a reference document and a checklist for those involved in building the family institution.

Especially:

- 1. All Family Members
 - To evaluate the achievements of the self and family members
 - •To measure and to identify one's own strengths and weaknesses and those of the family in the process of building a better family
- 2. Family Development Agencies
 - •To identify the family development needs in Kelantan
 - •To prepare the training and module in accordance with the requirements of the Kelantan Mawaddah Family Policy
 - •To assess the programme and training provided to ensure they are consistent with the desired criteria of a family

DEFINITION OF FAMILY

A family is founded on a valid marriage in which all the roles and responsibilities of the family members are in accordance with the requirements of the Qur'an and Sunnah, and all the family members receive love and compassion to make them feel safe, secure, at peace and happy.

MAWADDAH FAMILY MEMBERS

A Mawaddah family consists of the husband, the wife, the mother, the father and the children. It also includes the grandfather, the grandmother, other relatives and includes the domestic help.

MAWADDAH FAMILY DEVELOPMENT

This book contains the following seven aspects:




